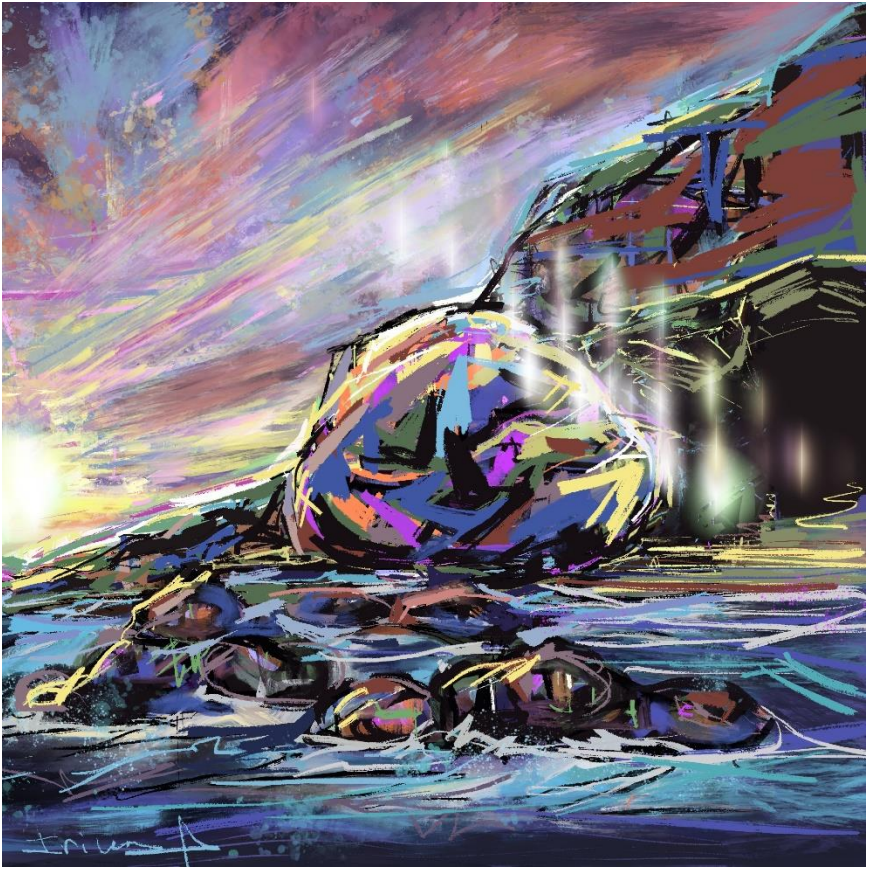

A Reading from the First Letter to the Corinthians
