From the Incumbent

This Sunday, **June 1**, we will plant our garden after the service; a light lunch will be provided for the gardening team.

We will also celebrate the ministry of Rev. Carol, giving thanks for the time she has shared with us. In lieu of a sermon, she will offer reflections on her life's journey. She will continue working at St. Timothy's until mid-July, after which she will focus on final preparations for her wedding and take a short break before beginning her next appointment at St. John's, Willowdale.

Next week, **June 8** will be our final special event before we slow down for the summer, marked by a three-fold celebration:

- An intergenerational Pentecost service featuring the sound of many languages; a musical offering from our children, who have been preparing their song since March Break; and special music from the adult choir to match the tone of this slightly more relaxed service.
- · A parish-wide indoor picnic.
- A parish-wide opportunity to clean up the church grounds and continue working on the raised beds and other outdoor areas.

To make this day a success, we need volunteers to assist with setup and takedown of the picnic, provide at least ten salads, contribute baked goods and condiments if you are able, and help with the outdoor work (please bring any gardening tools you think we might use).

June 15 will be marked by baptisms—an appropriate rite for the observance of Trinity Sunday.

Additionally, we will set up a couple of special displays in the parish hall. The Contemplative Art Group will present their spring pieces on June 15—the last coffee hour before we transition to Lemonade on the Lawn for the summer months—and the Outreach Committee is introducing a summer reading initiative designed to deepen our understanding of Indigenous culture and approaches to reconciliation.

St. Timothy's Community Garden Update – Let's Garden!

We're so excited that this Sunday, after the Church service, we will begin our clean-up and planting! This initial gardening day promises to be excellent!

Melanie Billark has done a superb job creating a gardening plan for the vegetables. We have a wide range of seedlings, including cabbage, kale, Pok Choi, lettuce, squash, peppers and more. We also have a selection of herbs, a few flower seedlings and a range of potted perennials.

You don't need to be a gardener – beginners are welcome! It's a great way to meet fellow parishioners, get some steps in, and contribute to our community garden.

I would also like to remind you that we have two other planned gardening dates, and we are looking for people who would be willing to participate in garden maintenance and harvesting throughout the summer. Lastly, we are looking for volunteers for our indoor picnic and contributions of salads and desserts. Volunteer lists are posted on the bulletin board. Questions can be directed to Deb up to May 26 and, after that date, please speak to the clergy or wardens or send your enquiries by e-mail to the church office.

As a reminder, our key dates are:

June 01 – Our initial planting of the raised beds and the clean-up of the flower bed surrounding the Church sign, if time permits. Melanie and Deb will ensure soil, mulch, gardening gloves and extra tools are available. However, volunteers are asked to bring gardening tools where they can. A light lunch will be provided for those who participate in this first gardening effort. June 01 will be our alternate date, if it rains.

June 08 – We will complete additional plantings, including introducing new plants in the bed under the Church sign. This will also be our opportunity to stake our growing seedlings. Deb will provide perennials, and any contributions of plants are welcome. Melanie will take the lead.

In keeping with last year's event, this will also be our general clean-up of the church grounds and possibly some additional planting, as time permits. Melanie will take the lead that day and will, again, provide guidance on how we prune and trim existing plants and bushes. Volunteers will take on the sizable task of cleaning all the beds. Melanie would also like to identify two or three leads, who can help co-ordinate the clean-up, giving our volunteers direction and assistance.

This will also be the date of our **Indoor Picnic**! Volunteers are requested to assist in setting up the luncheon. Contributions of salads and desserts are welcome. A sign-up list is posted on the Church bulletin board for picnic volunteers, including two to four individuals to take the lead in making these arrangements, and another for those wishing to contribute to the menu! Again, please feel free to speak to Deb directly and after May 26, please direct your questions to one of the clergy or wardens.
