From the Incumbent

Our spring adult education sessions, held on Sunday mornings, will survey the **History of Christian Sacred Music**, tracing the spiritual and cultural movements that shaped the songs of our faith across the centuries. New participants are always welcome. The course will unfold across seven sessions



- 1. Early Christian and Byzantine Chant Hildegard, Cassiani, and the sacred monophony of the early Church
- 2. Gregorian Chant to Polyphony Medieval developments and the rise of Western liturgical forms
- 3. Renaissance Polyphony Sacred harmony and the height of choral counterpoint
- 4. Baroque Innovations The world of Bach, Handel, and the oratorio tradition
- 5. *Hymns, Spirituals, and Gospel Roots* American sacred song and the witness of the African-American church
- 6. Romantic and Modern Choral Works From Brahms' Requiem to Benjamin Britten's War Requiem
- 7. Contemporary Composers and Global Sacred Sounds New expressions of sacred music in today's world

In addition to this series, we will also host **a special weeknight event** later this month. The Rev. Micah Latimer from Grace Church on-the-Hill will be joining us to share a personal reflection on incorporating music into worship and spiritual life. A few weeks ago, I was invited to speak at Grace as part of their Lenten teaching series, and several of you graciously came along. This evening will be our opportunity to return the hospitality, as Micah visits us and Grace parishioners are invited to join in. The event will include a presentation, conversation, and a shared meal — date TBD shortly.

Meanwhile, in our art group, we will turn our attention this spring to the Japanese aesthetic philosophy of *Wabi-Sabi*, which encourages us to **appreciate the worn, weathered, and handmade** — to see new life not in perfection, but in what has been lovingly repaired or recombined. We will experiment with kintsugi, the art of mending broken pottery with gold, and with mixed media collages that

incorporate pieces of old objects into new creations. This practice reminds us that resurrection, too, often comes not as a complete erasure of the past, but as a beautiful transformation that honours what has been broken. No experience is required — these are **particularly beginner friendly** methods! — and everyone is warmly welcome.

Outdoors, other creative opportunities await, both in the raised garden beds and on the larger church grounds. Please save these two key dates:

- Sunday, May 25 Seedling planting and possibly adding perennial flowers; after the church service. We will take our coffee mugs outside, and a light lunch will be provided outdoors for those who volunteer.
- Sunday, June 8 Grounds clean-up and any follow-up tasks from May. On this day, everyone is welcome to a parish-wide, end of academic year Indoor Picnic, served family style after the service, before those who choose to participate in the outdoor work head out. This event will require the assistance of as many volunteers as possible, so please let me or Deb (one of our wardens) know if you can help.

And finally, I will be taking my post Easter break this Sunday and leave you in the very capable hands of Rev. Carol and Jonathan.

St. Timothy's Community Garden Update – Calling All Volunteers

The weather has warmed up and the neighbourhoods are abuzz with gardening - the cleaning up of fall debris, pruning trees and bushes, and planting vegetables and flowers. Melanie Billark, artist and gardener, has acquired free seedlings for St. Timothy's from The Stop https://www.thestop.org/, which will be picked up on May 12. We will receive both vegetable and flower seedlings, but we don't know what varieties until the pick-up! Naturally, we will then determine with our St. Timothy's gardeners which other plants we want to introduce to our garden and our overall garden plan.

As a reminder, our key dates are:

May 25 – Our initial planting of the raised beds and the clean up of the flower bed surrounding the Church sign, if time permits. Melanie and Deb will ensure soil, mulch, gardening gloves and extra tools are available. However, volunteers are asked to bring gardening tools where they can. A light lunch will be provided for those who participate in this first gardening effort. June 01 will be our alternate date, if it rains. A sign-up list is on the Church bulletin board, but you can also approach Deb directly or send an email to the Church office.

June 01 – We will complete additional plantings, including introducing new plants in the bed under the Church sign. This will also be our opportunity to stake our growing seedlings. Deb will provide perennials, and any contributions of plants are welcome. A sign-up list is on the Church bulletin board, but you can also approach Deb directly or send an e-mail to the Church office.

June 08 – In keeping with last year's event, this will be our general clean-up of the church grounds and possibly some additional planting, as time permits. Melanie will take the lead that day and will, again, provide guidance on how we prune and trim existing plants and bushes. Volunteers will take on the sizable task of cleaning all the beds. Melanie would also like to identify two or three leads, who can help co-ordinate the clean-up, giving our volunteers direction and assistance. A sign-up list is on the Church bulletin board, but you can also approach Deb directly or send an e-mail to the Church office.

This will also be the date of our **Indoor Picnic**! Volunteers are requested to assist in setting up the luncheon. Contributions of salads and desserts are welcome. A sign-up list is posted on the Church bulletin board for picnic volunteers, including two to four individuals to take the lead in making these arrangements, and another for those wishing to contribute to the menu! Again, please feel free to speak to Deb directly.

Deb will be available this Sunday, **May 11** during coffee hour to discuss our gardening and picnic plans. Longer term, Deb will be establishing a roster of volunteers to weed and water our gardens.
