Our social and educational programming will take a pause over the summer months. This includes all weekday activities and Sunday education. Supervision for children during Sunday services will continue but in a more informal format, featuring free play, gardening, and outdoor time. Following our Sunday services, we will gather for lemonade on the front lawn instead of hot drinks in the parish hall.

Our garden will become the focal point of parish life this season, and a schedule for its care will be circulated soon. If you are interested in helping—even just on Sundays after the service—please speak to Deb or me.

During July and August, the clergy will take turns officiating Sunday liturgies, and most Sundays you will see only one of us present. Rev. Carol's last Sunday with us will be July 27. Jonathan and I will be taking our holidays at various points during the summer. One of us will always be available for pastoral care—please email us or the office if you need assistance, and we will ensure the message reaches the person on call.

My own summer plans, as always, include time at the cottage, triathlon races (including one in which my children will participate for the first time), painting, gardening, a couple of weddings, and a few days of camping (our first attempt since the kids were very small). I will also be working on an application for advanced academic studies in a program designed for clergy engaged in full-time ministry.

Let us take a moment to congratulate ourselves on these past months of winter and spring—so full of grace: grounded in worship, growing in fellowship, and open to wonder. As we enter the slower rhythm of summer, may we carry with us the gifts of this season. May we find time to rest, recharge, enjoy the beauty of nature, and nurture our social connections.

In the fall, we will return with expanded youth programming, an upgraded sound and live-streaming system well on its way to being installed and mastered by our volunteers, and a parish once again brimming with activity. Our Back-to-Church Sunday is scheduled for September 7, and our final parish event of the summer will be the work weekend at Moorelands, taking place September 12–14. Please mark these dates on your calendars—and until then, happy summer!

Collection for Those Evacuated Due to Ontario Wildfires

We have all been following news of the forest fires raging northwest of us. Families have been evacuated from Deer Lake and Webiqui. About 1100 of these folks are now housed in 4 GTA hotels. They are short on supplies and could be here until September. Rev. Nicola Skinner, the rector of Grace Church Markham, who initiated this ask, is coordinating the collection of items needed by folks who have been evacuated from the fire zones to Toronto, and we are joining our Anglican Colleagues in this initiative.

Here is our starter list of items that are needed. We are starting our collection immediately.
