From the Incumbent



I hope that this message finds you well and refreshed after the summer months. My family and I enjoyed a season of fantastic weather, rest and relaxation, plenty of reading, athletic pursuits, and a few new or long-forgotten adventures. The children and I all took part in triathlon races, we went camping as a family, and I finally had the joy of putting my youngest on a horse—my own favourite sport growing up and a shared interest with my parents, which the older children have already come to love.

This Sunday we return together after the summer months for the **Intergenerational Back to Church Service**. As part of our worship, we will dedicate our new sound and livestreaming system, made possible through the generosity of a recent parish bequest. We give thanks for this gift, which will help deepen our worship here in person and extend the reach of our community to those unable to be physically present. The installation involves new high quality equipment; yet I am pleased to say that it also re-uses many of our existing components. It will certainly improve the clarity of sound in the church and the quality of livestreaming for those who join us from home. But as the system is both advanced and complex, it will take us some time to master; we thank you for your patience as we learn its features and work toward smooth operation.

We also welcome **Cassidy Tsang** as our new **Children's Program Coordinator**.

Following the intergenerational service, we will gather for an **indoor BBQ with games**—a chance to reconnect, celebrate, and enjoy fellowship together.

All of our **weekday programming** begins after this Sunday:

- **Christmas Kitchen Cooking** – Mondays and Tuesdays
- **ESL classes** – Tuesday mornings
- **Adult Art Program** – Wednesday mornings
- **Weekday Eucharist** – Wednesday mornings
- **St. Andrew's Women's Group** – Wednesday mornings

Other groups such as several book clubs and the Old Orchard Blossoms (grandmothers' group) will be resuming shortly as well.

Sunday programs for all ages will include:

- **Adult Education and Youth (12+)** – begins the week of September 21
- **Children’s Programming** – resumes September 14 (on the 7th, the children will worship together with adults) to launch the art program led by Melanie Billark. This series will continue until Advent for children aged 10 and under, focusing on garden art (stones and clay), stained glass, printing, and two collaborative projects that will be installed in the church. Children ages 10–12 may choose between the art program and explicit faith instruction geared towards teens and adults. In Advent, children will switch gears to begin preparing for our Christmas plays.

On September 12–14, my family and I will join some of our parishioners at the Moorlands camp weekend, where we will lend a hand with the annual maintenance tasks.

I am looking forward to this new academic and church year with gratitude and excitement. May it be a season of growth, creativity, and renewed connection for our parish.

2025 Summer Reading

The Outreach Committee did some focused reading during the summer as a way to become active allies in the work of Truth and Reconciliation. Here follows a review of one of these books.


***Clearing the Plains: Disease, Politics of Starvation, and the Loss of Aboriginal Life* by James Daschuk**

I was stunned by what I learned from this book. The author does not claim indigenous or metis heritage. He has a Ph.D. in History and is currently an assistant professor in the Faculty of Kinesiology and Health Studies at the University of Regina.

The book began life as a doctoral dissertation and is dense and dry and I was unable to complete it. Nevertheless what I learned about the effects of deliberate government policies during the years surrounding confederation stunned me. Policies designed, as the sub-title explains, to one way or another remove first nations from the prairies in part to make way for the transcontinental railway and to facilitate European expansion westward.

This is not light reading. I was unable to complete the book but I do recommend it to anyone interested in learning a less common perspective on this period in Canadian history.
