From the Incumbent

As Thanksgiving approaches, I find myself reflecting on how much there is to be grateful for in our parish life. On most weekdays, there is so much activity in and around the church that I barely sit at my laptop—from group gatherings to volunteers quietly caring for others in ways that often go unseen, from pastoral visits to informal conversations. It is a joy to serve in a community so alive with generosity and concern for one another.



Next Sunday, October 20, we will celebrate the **Feast of St. Luke** (transferred from Saturday), long associated with healing and compassion. He is one of my favourite saints because his biblical and traditional composite portrait includes being a **healer**, **writer**, **and artist**—three kinds of gifts that inspire me in others. At this service, I would like to introduce a new ministry of **one-on-one prayer and anointing during Communion**, held in the chapel at the same time as Communion is being received. I hope to arrange for two individuals to be present each Sunday in the side chapel to pray with anyone who wishes to receive it, quietly and confidentially. When no one comes forward, these volunteers will use the time to pray for those on our parish prayer list. Please let me know if you're interested in helping with this addition to our services. Our newly certified lay anointers, whom I will introduce to you on this day, will anchor this ministry whenever they are present at church.

This theme of care will continue in the coming weeks as we begin an initiative I have been developing recently, called **Companions in Care**. This is not another ministry to take on, but rather a way for the clergy to **support and sustain those who already offer care**—pastoral, spiritual, or practical. Our gatherings, held a few times a year, will include a short prayer service and reflection on Scripture, followed by conversation and lunch. My hope is that these gatherings will nurture and connect those who so generously care for others. Please let me know if you'd like to attend these gatherings. The first one will be on Thursday October 23 at noon.

Also next weekend, during the coffee hour, we will host a **Ministry Fair**—an opportunity for each parish group and ministry to share what they do and welcome others to learn more. Tables will be set up in the parish hall with representatives from each area of parish life. It is a wonderful way to see the breadth of what happens at St. Timothy's and how our individual gifts contribute to the life of the whole.

Our weekday Eucharist continues each Wednesday at 11:30 a.m. in the chapel. Before each Wednesday service—and on Sundays as well—you are invited to light a candle in prayer. The candles are placed safely in a tub of sand, allowing them to remain lit throughout the service. You may light your candle from another's flame or from the altar candle as a sign of shared prayer and presence.

Our **Outreach Committee** is also continuing its **clothing drive** for local children. Snowsuits have already been purchased through the Outreach funds, and we are now collecting items to complete the sets—hats, boots, and neck warmers for elementary-school-aged children.

Donations can be brought to the church office Tuesdays through Thursdays, as well as on Sundays.

Finally, as part of our **anniversary year**—the cornerstone of the current church nave dates to September 30, 1950—I invite you to read about **St. Timothy** who gives our parish its name. Paul's companion, teacher, and leader in the early Church, Timothy came from a multicultural background, and his faith was shaped to a large extent by the women in his family: his mother, Eunice, and grandmother, Lois. Who was St. Timothy?

You may also wish to look at our <u>Fall Guide 2025</u>, which outlines parish activities and opportunities for participation between now and Advent.
