Our fall season continues with wonderful energy across our parish life. Thank you to everyone who has contributed time, music, conversation, and care to make our community so vibrant and welcoming.



Our regular schedule continues:

- **Sunday Eucharist** at 10:00 a.m. with Children's message and educational programming for all ages
- The Youth Group for ages 12 and up gathers after the Sunday service for conversation, games, and community time
- ESL ministry and Christmas Kitchen cooking on Tuesdays
- Wednesday Eucharist at 11:30 a.m. in the chapel, preceded by the Art
 Group and followed by St Andrew's Women's Group; all three
 opportunities offering a space for creativity, contemplation, and fellowship
- Morning Prayer on Zoom every weekday at 9:30 a.m.—all are welcome to join for this brief and reflective start to the day.
- The **Little Pantry** remains an ongoing expression of our care for neighbours. Donations of non-perishable food are always welcome.

Last week's **healing service with anointing** was a moving experience for many, and we are pleased to continue offering **individual prayer and anointing during Communion** each Sunday in the side chapel. You are also welcome to light a taper there in personal prayer, either before the service or during Communion.

Spotlight: Join the Choir

Have you ever thought about singing with the choir? This is the perfect time to join. At St. Timothy's, our choir brings together both **professional section leads** and **volunteer singers**, creating an inspiring balance of guidance and participation. The presence of paid leads isn't meant to create a divide or discourage amateur singers—quite the opposite, it's there both to enhance the sound, and help singers learn and grow together.

You don't need to read music perfectly—just bring your enthusiasm and a willingness to listen and blend your voice with others. Rehearsals are held once a month on a Thursday evening and on Sunday mornings before the service.

The Young Shoppers' Room at the Christmas Kitchen is a place for children aged 12 and younger to buy Christmas gifts for their loved ones. Nothing costs more than \$6 and the children are assisted by elves when needed so their presents will be a surprise on Christmas Day.

There are a number of ways people can help make this room a success:

- 1. Contributions of gift items are needed. Popular items include soaps, candles, mugs, etc. Gifts for Dad are especially welcome as they are usually in short supply. Note that the maximum price for articles in this room is \$6, so please do not be too extravagant (although multi-item sets such as toiletry items can always be divided).
- 2. Contributions of gift bags, tissue paper and peel and stick gift tags are useful for wrapping purchases.
- 3. If you are a teenager and like helping younger children, consider volunteering as an elf. If you know a teenager who might like to help, please mention this opportunity to them. Volunteer hours can be counted towards Community Service Hours.
