Leader: That within the whole company of Christ's
pilgrim people, (... and) we may come to the
inheritance of the saints in glory,
we pray to you, O Lord:

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: In communion with all the saints, let us commend
the world to the mercy and protection of God.

All: Amen.

The Collect for the Day

Leader: God all powerful,
who called Martin from the armies of this world
to be a faithful soldier of Christ:
give us grace to follow him

and enable your Church to claim for all people
