#### Christmas Kitchen — November 29, 10:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m.

Preparations are well underway for the Christmas Kitchen! As in previous years, we'll have the bake sale, lunch cafe, preserves, crafts for the children, the young shoppers' room, Santa's photos, and the mini-auction. Volunteers are especially needed on the day for early-morning bun-cutting, setup, serving, and cleanup, as well as on Thursday and Friday for various tasks. Sign up sheets are on the board. #### Advent Potluck - Saturday, November 30 at 5:00 p.m.

Join us on the evening of Advent I for a parish potluck! We will gather at 5:30 p.m. for appetizers, followed by a shared meal. Please bring a favourite dish to contribute. All ages are welcome—this is a wonderful opportunity to begin the season of Advent in fellowship and gratitude.

#### Advent Art Project - Adult Art Group

The Adult Art Group (Wednesdays, 10:00–11:15 a.m.) will create a communal Advent-themed collage under the guidance of Melanie Billark, using donated fabric scraps. All adults are welcome to join the sessions throughout Advent.

- St. Andrew's Ladies' Group will transition to Zoom for the winter months, meeting online rather than in person.



# Can you help?

The Young Shoppers' Room at the Christmas Kitchen is a place for children aged 12 and younger to buy Christmas gifts for their loved ones. Nothing costs more than \$6 and the children are assisted by elves when needed so their presents will be a surprise on Christmas Day.

There are a number of ways people can help make this room a success:

- 1. Contributions of gift items are needed. Popular items include soaps, candles, mugs, etc. Gifts for Dad are especially welcome as they are usually in short supply. Note that the maximum price for articles in this room is \$6, so please do not be too extravagant (although multi-item sets such as toiletry items can always be divided).
- 2. Contributions of gift bags, tissue paper and peel and stick gift tags are useful for wrapping purchases.
- 3. If you are a teenager and like helping younger children, consider volunteering as an elf. If you know a teenager who might like to help, please mention this opportunity to them. Volunteer hours can be counted towards Community Service Hours.


