

Advent at St. Timothy's

This year our Advent Sundays follow the special themes introduced in last week's newsletter:

- Advent I Nov 30: St. Andrew's Anniversary, marking the 70th anniversary of our St. Andrew's Ladies' Group, and the beginning of the liturgical year.
- Advent II Dec 7: Maria Reolin, the Executive Director of Flemingdon Park Ministry, will share insights from her recent work and ministry in this needfilled area of the city.
- Advent III Dec 14: Christmas Pageant & Intergenerational Service, led by our children and youth in story, music, and prayer.
- Advent IV Dec 21: Pamela Armogan, the Program Head of St. George House, will speak about the ministry and life of this community, where Jonathan maintains a regular chaplaincy time and where we help out with various outreach projects.

Special Services

Towards the end of Advent, two services will help us enter the final days before Christmas with depth and beauty:

Deanery Quiet Christmas - Tuesday, December 16, 7:00 p.m.

A gentle service for those seeking peace, healing, and stillness. This year, the service will be held at St. Clement's Church.

Lessons & Carols - Thursday, December 18, 7:30 p.m.

Our own candlelit service of Scripture and song, always a highlight of the season.

Breakaway Retreat

Our parish retreat, Breakaway, will be the first major event of the upcoming year (Jan 30 – Feb 1). There are two ways to participate:

- The away option takes place at Fair Havens, Beaverton, for the full weekend.
- The at-home option includes lunch and a special Sunday presentation after church, given by Mike Janzen, a JUNO-nominated jazz musician and worship leader in the Anglican Church.

The theme of the education sessions offered at the "away option" is "Practicing the Image of God." Together we will explore what it means to live as bearers of the divine image through contemplative practices, embodied activities, and theological reflection. The retreat will be led by The Rev. Dr. Michelle Voss, ordained minister in the United Church of Canada, professor of theology, and Past Principal of Emmanuel College (Toronto School of Theology). Dr. Voss draws on her expertise in theology, spirituality, and interfaith dialogue, and creates inclusive spaces where participants can encounter the mystery of God in the fullness of human diversity.
















At Fair Havens our Guest Speaker will be Dr. Michelle Voss

Dr. Michelle Voss is the Director of Master of Divinity Programs and Professor of Theology at Emmanuel College, Toronto School of Theology. She was the 13th principal of Emmanuel College (2018–21) and the first

woman to lead the institution as Principal in its 90-year history. She led the school through a consolidation of its multireligious programs, a period of significant faculty renewal, and the first 18 months of the COVID-19 pandemic. She is also an ordained minister of the United Church of Canada. An expert in comparative theology, Dr. Voss has also written widely about aesthetics, gender, embodiment, disability, and interculturalism in the church.

This year we will have an "At Home" component as well:

Lunch and Presentation/Recital by Mike Janzen

Mike Janzen is a JUNO- and GMA-nominated musician who has performed in concert halls, churches and festivals across North America, and led worship at Little Trinity Anglican Church, combining undeniable talent with a desire to create music that draws attention to the Maker. Melding jazz, pop and classical styles, Mike brings an imaginative and fresh voice to the current music scene. From soul-stirring songwriting to mesmerizing piano solos, Mike's music is approachable and hits the deep places of the heart. His recent works include "The Psalms Project" (2021/Independent), a collection of Psalms-inspired sacred songs that emerged during his long period of recovery from a serious concussion injury.
