From the Incumbent

As Christmas draws near, I'd like to offer you my warmest greetings and best wishes for celebrations that are peaceful, meaningful, and truly nourishing. May this special season help you discern new directions for the year ahead, or, if life remains much as it is, may you find deeper meaning within familiar rhythms and commitments.



At Christmas we proclaim a mystery that is both cosmic and intimately personal: "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it" (John 1:5). Our faith dares to tell us that God was not only born once for us, but seeks to be born in us again and again, whenever love becomes embodied in our choices and our patience, our courage and forgiveness, our prayers and care for one another, and the myriad other ways that belong to the mystery we call the Incarnation.

A Fruitful Advent at St. Timothy's

As we look back over Advent, I am grateful for how much goodness and grace we have shared together. In particular, **our Christmas Pageant this past Sunday** was truly lovely—remarkably smooth, calm, and heartfelt. There was a gentle reverence to it that felt fitting for the story we were telling. **The Deanery Quiet Christmas service** was also beautiful, offering candlelight, spacious contemplative opportunities, a thoughtful message and prayers, and the deep warmth of the cello. It was especially moving how the service gathered favourite elements from each church's own traditions for this kind of liturgy. Our own **Carols by Candlelight** was once again a tour de force from our choir and Ed—an offering of beauty and devotion, and a real gift in the midst of a busy season.

This year, our Family Christmas Eve service will take on a simple and contemplative form. Instead of a pageant, the familiar figures of the Nativity—Mary, Joseph, shepherds, angels, magi, and a couple of animals—will be represented by members of our community in minimal costume, with all children in attendance receiving small props to help them enter the story. Each character will read a brief line of Scripture and an imaginative prayer, inviting us to consider how the miracle of the Incarnation might have been experienced by those who first witnessed it. There will also be plenty of opportunity to sing our favourite Christmas carols as we celebrate the joy and wonder of Christ's birth together. Think of it as a family-friendly version of Lessons and Carols!

At Fair Havens our Guest Speaker will be Dr. Michelle Voss

Dr. Michelle Voss is the Director of Master of Divinity Programs and Professor of Theology at Emmanuel College, Toronto School of Theology. She was the 13th principal of Emmanuel College (2018–21) and the first

woman to lead the institution as Principal in its 90-year history. She led the school through a consolidation of its multireligious programs, a period of significant faculty renewal, and the first 18 months of the COVID-19 pandemic. She is also an ordained minister of the United Church of Canada. An expert in comparative theology, Dr. Voss has also written widely about aesthetics, gender, embodiment, disability, and interculturalism in the church.

Lunch and Presentation/Recital by Mike Janzen

Mike Janzen is a JUNO- and GMA-nominated musician who has performed in concert halls, churches and festivals across North America, and led worship at Little Trinity Anglican Church, combining undeniable talent with a desire to create music that draws attention to the Maker. Melding jazz, pop and classical styles, Mike brings an imaginative and fresh voice to the current music scene. From soul-stirring songwriting to mesmerizing piano solos, Mike's music is approachable and hits the deep places of the heart. His recent works include "The Psalms Project" (2021/Independent), a collection of Psalms-inspired sacred songs that emerged during his long period of recovery from a serious concussion injury.
