


Welcome to St Timothy's

Opening Sentences

Leader: O Lord, open our lips,

All: **and our mouth shall proclaim your praise.**

Leader: Your light springs up for the righteous

From the rising of the sun to its setting

Psalm 69

Answer me, O Lord, for your steadfast love is good;
according to your abundant mercy, turn to me.

**Do not hide your face from your servant,
for I am in distress—make haste to answer me.**

Draw near to me, redeem me,
set me free because of my enemies.

**You know the insults I receive,
and my shame and dishonour;
my foes are all known to you.**

Insults have broken my heart,
so that I am in despair.

**I looked for pity, but there was none;
and for comforters, but I found none.**

They gave me poison for food,
and for my thirst they gave me vinegar to drink.

Reading

Consider him who endured such hostility against himself from sinners, so that you may not grow weary or lose heart. In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the

point of shedding your blood. And you have forgotten the exhortation that addresses you as children—

'My child, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord,
or lose heart when you are punished by him;
for the Lord disciplines those whom he loves,
and chastises every child whom he accepts.'

Endure trials for the sake of discipline. God is treating you as children; for what child is there whom a parent does not discipline? If you do not have that discipline in which all children share, then you are illegitimate and not his children. Moreover, we had human parents to discipline us, and we respected them. Should we not be even more willing to be subject to the Father of spirits and live? For they disciplined us for a short time as seemed best to them, but he disciplines us for our good, in order that we may share his holiness. Now, discipline always seems painful rather than pleasant at the time, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it.

Hebrews 12: 3 - 11

Reader: Listen to what the Spirit is saying to the churches.

All: **Thanks be to God.**

The Collect for the Day
