We had a very busy and enjoyable weekend last week, both at Breakaway and here at home. They both did fantastically. The highlights of my time at Breakaway included doing our best (and at times failing spectacularly!) to follow a yoga DVD with a few fellow early birds on Saturday morning, a magical afternoon cross-country skiing through the forest with my son, lively mealtime conversations, and creating a rather avant-garde-looking collage during one of the sessions.



Back at church on Sunday, Mike Janzen truly blew our socks off. Not only is he a virtuosic pianist—capable of playing even while wearing oven mitts (which he literally did for one piece!)—he is also a compelling speaker. He generously shared the story of his three-year recovery from a concussion, the role his faith played in returning to composing and arranging music, and the place of music within his spiritual life. Lent begins in just under a couple of weeks. **Ash Wednesday falls on February 18**, with our usual **services at 11:30 a.m. and 7:30 p.m.** Of course, this also means that our **Pancake Supper** is just around the corner, **on February 17 from 5:30 to 7:00 p.m.** Please let Anne DeGrasse know if you are able to help flip pancakes, set up, or assist with cleanup.

Lenten Education

Throughout Lent, we will offer two special seasonal education opportunities.

- 1) **On Sunday mornings**, from 8:30 to 9:30 a.m., we will explore the traditional Lenten disciplines—prayer, reading Scripture, almsgiving, and fasting—consider their scriptural roots, make connections to music and art, and brainstorm ways to practice these disciplines in contemporary life in a non-punitive and life-giving way.
- 2) The second study opportunity will take place **on Mondays at noon**, beginning February 23, with lunch provided. Titled *Embodied Love: From Creation to the Cross*, this series will explore the facets of our humanity that most closely reflect God's presence in the world and imitate Jesus' self-giving. The sessions will be co-led by me, Jonathan, and guest facilitator Thomas Lai, who is an expressive arts therapist with a particular interest in spirituality explored through music, movement, and art. This series is intentionally experiential rather than academic, so please consider attending even if education sessions are not usually part of your routine.

At the end of the month, our **Annual Vestry Meeting** will take place on **Sunday, February 22** following the service. An additional Q&A session focused specifically on parish finances will be held before the service. Annual reports will be distributed this weekend.

Lastly, on **Thursday February 12 at lunchtime**, we will also gather again for **Companions in Care**. All those who serve as caregivers—whether in practical or spiritual ways—are warmly invited to join us for lunch, Scripture reading, conversation about home communion and stocking frozen meals at the church, and a time of mutual support.

OUTREACH CORNER

Vestry Motion for 2026:

Recommitting to "Protect, Sustain and Renew the Life of the Earth."

In our baptismal covenant, we pledge to “safeguard the integrity of God’s creation and respect, sustain and renew the life of the earth.” This is part of our worship of God who created all things and our duty of care to our neighbour, particularly those who are most vulnerable to a changing climate. Cast the Net call #8 in particular calls us to “intensify advocacy and action in response to the climate crisis.”

For many of us in the Diocese of Toronto, 2025 was the year that the climate crisis truly hit home. Wildfires, an increasingly regular feature of summers in much of northern and western Canada, raged in our own communities of Kawartha Lakes and Haliburton. Farmers’ crops and suburban gardens suffered under drought conditions. And the city of Toronto had six heat warnings this past summer – double or triple those in recent years.

There are things we can do as individuals and as parish communities to minimize and mitigate our climate impacts. But we also need to raise our voices with our elected officials and hold them accountable to their climate action commitments.

The following Motion will be presented at Vestry:

We, the parish of St Timothy's North Toronto in the Diocese of Toronto, pledge to honour our baptismal commitment to “safeguard the integrity of God’s creation” and urge the Government of Canada to honour its commitments to the Paris Accord, 2015: to reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions by 40-45% below 2005 levels by 2030 and to achieve net-zero emissions by 2050.
