This year, we are once again supporting **Rosalie Hall**, a social services organization that provides support to pregnant girls and women up to the age of 29, support for young parents including parenting groups and childcare along with access to food and baby supplies, opportunities for young mothers to complete high school and access to scholarship opportunities for the young parents.

Our spring sale will take place on **Sunday, May 3rd**, during coffee hour.

Any parishioner who wishes can 'sponsor' by purchasing all or a part of any item from the Group. We will then donate the items to Rosalie Hall.

Items for sale include beautifully knitted or crocheted **blankets** (\$40), **sweaters** (\$25-\$30), **hats for infants** as well as the ever-practical '**onesie**' (\$15-\$30).

NEW this year - in addition to the sale, we are looking for donations of *diapers, formula and gently used clothing for infants and young children.*

We will collect items from **April 12 to May 3** via boxes in the narthex and main hallway outside the kitchen.

"Decolonizing Church" Book Launch, April 22

On Wednesday, April 22 at 7:00 p.m., St. Stephen in-the-Fields (103 Bellevue Ave., Toronto) will host the launch of the book "Decolonizing Church: Emerging Voices Speak," edited by Nestor Medina and Becca Whitla. Drawing on varied theological voices, the book aims to open conversations about how churches can engage the task of redressing the colonial legacy and its harms, and, in so doing, model the gratuitous disruptive power of the good news. She Holds Up the Stars

Organizing Call for Grassy Narrows River Run, April 28. The First Nations community of Grassy Narrows in northwestern Ontario has been seeking justice since about ten tons of mercury were discharged into the Wabigoon River from an upstream pulp and paper mill between 1962 and 1970. Generations of community members continue to suffer the physical, social, and economic impacts of mercury contamination, exacerbated by ongoing industrial and extractive activities in their territories.

Members of Grassy Narrows and supporters will be marching to Queen's Park on Weds. Sept. 23 in the biannual River Run to call for *fair compensation* for the mercury crisis, *ending pollution* from industry, mining, and waste disposal. OUTREACH CORNER

Hurricane Melissa struck Jamaica as a Category 5 Hurricane on October 28, 2025. It was the strongest and costliest hurricane ever to hit the country. The storm killed 54 people and caused widespread destruction leading to homelessness, shortages of food and water and about half of the places of worship on the island were destroyed or damaged.



In response Bishop Andrew Asbil has issued an **Appeal for Jamaican Relief and Reconstruction**. This appeal is not just about reconstructing buildings: it is about restoring communities. By giving, Canadian Anglicans are helping these churches continue to be centres of strength and healing in the midst of devastation.

The Bishop's appeal includes a \$50,000 matching grant from FaithWorks, meaning that every dollar given up to that amount will be matched, resulting in a possible \$100,000.

From the Outreach Budget the Outreach Committee has donated \$1,000. which will be matched by FaithWorks.
